Questions for Candidates

Candidates for the Illinois Scholastic Journalism Educator of the Year co-sponsored by IJEA and EIU Department of Journalism must respond to each of the following prompts in essay form. Each response should be limited to 300 words or less.

- 1. Describe your journalism teaching/advising assignment, touching on the journalism curriculum, number of student participants, forum status of your student news medium/media and challenges facing your journalism program.
- 2. What recognition have you, your students and their news medium/media received in the past year?
- 3. What specific evidence can you provide of the positive impact your journalism students and their media have had on student culture and the school community?
- 4. What is your plan for getting school officials to recognize the value of the scholastic press and convincing them to support free and responsible student news media?
- 5. How would you use the platform of "Illinois Journalism Teacher of the Year" to address the issues of scholastic journalism?
